


2022 SESSION

- Dems controlled all statewide offices and full state-government trifecta.
- Dems enjoyed large margins in both chambers:
 - 20 Ds vs 15 Rs in the Senate
 - 41 Ds vs 24 Rs in the House.
- Caucuses: Business friendly Dems, Progressive Dems, moderate Republicans, privacy caucus.



WHAT ABOUT THE STATE LEGISLATURE?

HOUSE

- House will likely stay in Democrat control
- Several more "true progressives" entering the statehouse, but there will likely be an overall lower number of democrats
- Large freshman class entering House (esp Rs)
- Entirely new leadership

SENATE

- Senate is technically a tossup between R & D control
- Big news with Senator Kevin Priola switching parties
- Several former House members are moving over to the Senate







- On The Ballot 7 measures
 - Decriminalization and Regulated Access Program for Certain <u>Psychedelic Plants and Fungi Initiative</u> – Statutory
 - <u>State Income Tax Rate Reduction Initiative</u> Statutory
 - <u>Twenty-Third Judicial District Amendment</u>– Ref/Constitutional
 - Homestead Exemption to Surviving Spouses of U.S. Armed Forces
 Members and Veterans Amendment Ref/Constitutional
 - <u>Charitable Gaming Amendment</u> Ref/Constitutional
 - <u>Reduce Income Tax Deduction Amounts to Fund School Meals</u> <u>Program Measure</u>– Ref/Statutory
 - Include Income Tax Effects in Initiative Ballot Language Measure– Ref/Statutory


2023 EXPECTATIONS



FUTURE FORECAST

- MANY new legislators
 - NO house Rs have ever been in majority & NO house Ds have ever been in the minority
- New leadership (House & JBC)
- Smaller margins in both chambers = different political calculations
- Rising inflation (TABOR not keeping pace)
- Limited revenue for 2023, TABOR refunds
